The Western Parkland City is the economic powerhouse of Australia. It is home to one third of Sydney's skilled manufacturing workforce. With a forecast population of 1.4 million by 2036, it is also one of Australia's fastest growing urban areas.

The scope and potential for private sector investment opportunities in the Western Parkland City are enormous, thanks to its significant geographic scale, growing population and increasing global connectivity. These considerable growth factors are collectively underpinned by catalytic government investments including:

- A new 24/7 curfew free international passenger and cargo airport opening in 2026 in the heart of the city.
- Bradfield City Centre a 114-hectare city being built for the 22nd Century on the doorstep of the new airport
- \$20 billion in government funding for critical transport infrastructure including new motorways, a Metro rail and an international airport.
- The Western Sydney Aerotropolis 11,200 hectares surrounding the new airport, with more than half rezoned and ready for investment and development.

The Western Parkland City Authority is exploring new and innovative ways to amplify the impact of these projects within the Aerotropolis. We are investigating how we can further the investment potential of the Aerotropolis Precincts through concepts such as:

- A smarter approach to multi-utility infrastructure.
- · Clean green technology.
- A 24/7 Airfreight Interface concept for high value cargo.

As the coordinating and investment attraction Authority responsible for the Western Parkland City, we are working with all levels of government in Australia and industry internationally to realise the once-in-a-generation opportunities building a new city presents.





At the heart of the Aerotropolis, the 114-hectare Bradfield City Centre will be Australia's newest city centre. It will be a beacon for a young and an ambitious workforce. Construction on the city's first building will begin in late 2022.

Australia's peak science organisation, the CSIRO, will move its physics, material sciences, astronomy, information technology and data research into a new purpose-built facility in the Bradfield City Centre.

The Advanced Manufacturing Research Facility (AMRF)


» underway

Located in the Bradfield City Centre, the Advanced Manufacturing Research Facility (AMRF) will be a shared platform for collaboration and innovation. The NSW Government is trialling the concept of the AMRF by investing in a high-tech industrial research facility that will be located in the first building of the Bradfield City Centre by late 2023. It will give business access to:

- · Leading edge test laboratories and equipment
- High-tech, industry relevant manufacturing equipment
- Reconfigurable research and manufacturing spaces
- Rapid prototyping facilities including 3D printing and additive manufacturing
- · Virtual and augmented reality equipment

The New Education and Training Model

» underway

We are delivering a ground-breaking New Education and Training Model (NETM) in collaboration with industry, universities, Vocational Education and Training (VET) providers and government. The NSW Government has committed \$37.4 million to co-develop and co-deliver 100 micro-credentials through the NETM, creating more than 7000 training opportunities.

The Agribusiness Precinct

» under investigation

We are investigating investment opportunities for the zoned Agribusiness Precinct directly adjacent to the new airport. Early market investigations have identified a strong appetite for:

- 24/7 state-of-the art logistics, facilities and services
- Dedicated road links providing seamless connection between producers and global markets
- A contemporary airfreight interface operation in the precinct, providing dedicated first and last mile channels for ambient, chilled and live air cargo products
- 36-hour paddock to plate service
- Modernised digital supply chain for seamless connectivity between trading partners

Transitioning to a Clean and Circular Economy

» under investigation

We are examining investor interest in the potential for a dedicated zone northeast of the Airport to fast-track Australia's transition to a clean and circular economy. We will measure investor and government appetite for:

- Decarbonised supply chains, new sustainable products and systems to avoid waste
- State-of-the-art technology turning wasted resources into new products
- Intelligent recycling of wastewater to cool and green our city
- Turning organic waste into clean energy to power new industries
- Driving global sustainable practices through research, testing and sharing



Multi-Utility Corridor Network

» under investigation

We are exploring how to best develop a network of purpose designed corridors for roads and service utilities.

- More efficient ways to design and deliver electricity, gas, water and telecommunications infrastructure
- Potential for multi-use underground corridor alongside roads
- Incorporating dual purpose functionality, including usable recreational space

There are significant investment opportunities planned or underway in the Aerotropolis. With a record \$20 billion of public infrastructure funding committed, substantial contractor involvement will be required to deliver the Aerotropolis.

A 1,616-hectare precinct providing high order employment uses including freight and logistics, warehousing, technology, creative industry, fresh food markets, education, health, visitor accommodation, recreation and entertainment. A major interface with Western Sydney Airport, it takes in the approved Sydney Science Park, which will comprise a town centre with Metro rail, commercial buildings and housing.

Agribusiness Precinct

Over 1,130 hectares offering key access points to the new Airport, allowing the development of agribusiness uses which could include integrated logistics, air freight, integrated intensive production, food innovation, fresh product and value-added foodpharmaceuticals.

Western Sydney International Airport



A 24/7 hour curfew free international airport, scheduled to open in Q4 2026.


Sydney Metro - Western Sydney Airport

A 23-kilometre railway currently under construction that will link residential areas with job hubs, including the Aerotropolis, and connect travellers from the new airport to the rest of Sydney's public transport system. Work on a business case to extend this link to fast growing suburbs in the South West has begun.

5 Mamre Road

Provides approximately 850 hectares of rezoned industrial land that will accommodate world-class warehouse and logistics facilities.

6 Clean and Circular Economy

Potential for business opportunities in resource and material management, water and renewable energy, organics, industrial by-products, construction waste, and household recyclables.

Multi-utility corridor network

Relates to the design and delivery of green infrastructure, transport and utility services to optimise the efficient use of land and minimise cost and waste.

Bradfield City Centre

A 114-hectare city for the 22nd Century, being built on the doorstep of the new airport. Construction will start in late 2022.
